

## The Family Perspective

Having lived in Greensboro for a long time, my family felt that we were familiar with the Craftsbury Community Care Center. We remembered when it was being built, had read newspaper articles about it over the years, and knew it to be a place where older people could live in their own space, while enjoying the convenience of prepared meals and the safety of living in a community setting. Through personal experience, however, we learned that it is so much more.

Last year our 96-year-old mother, Angela West, reluctantly gave up living independently in her Connecticut home, and moved to Vermont to be near family here. When we brought her to the 4C's to visit before deciding to move in, the bright, comfortable and beautifully maintained common areas and rooms made us all feel that this would be a place where she could live happily. It was the things we couldn't see, though, that really made it be the right place for her.

The degree of caring and welcoming on the part of the staff was truly remarkable. Everyone there made a tremendous effort to introduce themselves, to make her feel a part of the community, to get to know her and to make her feel welcomed and loved. That goal was accomplished within a very short time.

Sadly, our mom lived for only a little over a month after she took up residence. Upon her passing, we, her family, became the recipients of the same spirit of caring and love that was shown to her. We will be forever thankful that this was the setting in which our mom got to spend the final weeks of her life, in happiness and peace, and surrounded by such loving and compassionate people.

Interview with Joanne Chase



For decorations she would create a centerpiece of artificial flowers to use on the table. Every week was something new. She enjoyed talking with others. After fifty five years of marriage, John passed away. She moved to Vermont to be close to her daughter.

She misses the ocean, taking walks along the shore, swimming, and talking with the many people she knew. However, she finds the mountains, fields, lakes, and flowers of Vermont beautiful. She still enjoys singing, decorating with flowers, and meeting and talking with new people. She's very much enjoying living at Craftsbury Community Care Center.
